Why a 2020 Bond Now?

- Proposition 51 is fully committed. Currently, Proposition 51 has applications to commit fully all of its new construction and modernization funds.
- There is a new unfunded backlog of \$1 billion which is growing by \$150 million per month.
- Proposition 13 - the Public Preschool, K-12 and College



Health and Safety Bond Act of 2020 - will provide \$2.8 billion in New Construction and \$5.2 billion in Modernization funds for school districts and \$2 billion for community colleges.

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About Proposition 13

AB 48 (O'Donnell) Signed by Governor Newsom as Chapter 530/Statutes of 2019

Proposition 13 - the \$15 billion Public Preschool, K-12 and College Health and Safety Bond Act of 2020 - is on the ballot for the March 3, 2020 Statewide Primary Election.

In addition to K-12 (\$9 billion) and Community Colleges (\$2 billion), the bill includes California State Universities (\$2 billion) and University of California (\$2 billion).

K-12 Programs Funded:

- New Construction at \$2.8 Billion
- Modernization at \$5.2 Billion
 - Lead in Water Testing and Remediation \$150 Million (Out of Modernization)
- Career Technical Education at \$500 Million
- Charter Schools at \$500 Million

The bill also includes:

- Increased state matching amounts for low-wealth school districts
- Health and Safety Projects
- Disaster Assistance
- Financial Hardship Expansion
- Small School District Assistance
- Maintains the School Facility Program as an eligibility-based state matching grant program with assistance for districts needing additional help
